Finally, it won't be long before we welcome back Tim and Judy Proger when the build at Barn Cottage on Church Lane is completed

Life for Evenlode seems increasingly to revolve around planning applications, and the past year has seen quite a few. In fact there was a time when that part of Horn Lane which leads to the junction with Church Lane was one large building site with works going on simultaneously at The Clerk's Cottage; Holly Tree House; Springside Cottage and Lode House!!

Little Orchard now has its planning permission and is up for sale, as is Virginia's cottage. New agricultural barns have appeared in the field by the Adlestrop turn and the field next to Barn Cottage; and work to Grange Farm and Home Farm continues. Outstanding planning applications relate to Anchor Farm; Evenlode House, and at Sybil's Farm (which is part of Evenlode Grounds land) as well as Manor Farm.

Apart from all this, there have been three new gates installed along the footpath towards Chastleton House as part of a rolling programme of installing new stiles and gates around the village, and you'll have noticed work to fell dead or dying Ash trees along our lanes to prevent danger or accidents.
